I have applied certain agreed-upon procedures, as discussed below, to the Official Ballots for the 2004 Election. It is understood that this report is solely for the Election Committee of the Korean War Veterans Association, Inc., and Candidates in said election. The procedures and results were as follows:

Ballot Counting Procedures:

1. Use the current member roster provided by KWVA.
2. Ballots received no later than July 10, 2004.
3. Vote must not exceed stipulation on ballot, i.e. President (one) $1^{\text {th }}$ VP (one) $2^{\text {nd }}$ VP (one) Director (four) Referendum (one)
4. Photocopied ballots not accepted.
5. All Members except Associate and Auxiliary may vote.
6. If no label on Ballot, member must include name, address and number.

I set up a system of counting the ballots whereby each ballot has been numbered and canceled. (So as to prevent double counting). I also setup a system whereby votes could not exceed the stipulations above. If an official ballot was received that voted for less than the stipulations it was counted. If an official ballot was received that voted for more than stipulated in one area but for the limited number in the others, it was counted for those areas where the votes did not exceed the stipulated number.

Based upon the above procedures I sumamit to you my tabulation of the election results as scheduled on the following page. The Official Count column I summit as the votes meeting the above criteria.

Because my procedures were limited to those described above, I do not express an opinion on any systems in use at the Korean War Vetexans Association, Inc. Current member roster status was confirmed with Ms. Nancy Monson.
